DRAFT MINUTES OF TRING SQUASH CLUB AGM HELD AT THE CLUB ON THURSDAY 03 OCTOBER 2024 AT 7:30 PM

The President opened the meeting and extended a warm welcome to all. There were 32 full adult members present.

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received from: Jo Preston, Tony Eaude, Sue Littler and Mike Griffiths

2. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS AGM

The minutes of the AGM held on the 27th of September 2023 had been circulated by e-mail and posted on the Club website in advance of the meeting and were taken as read. Approval was agreed unanimously.

3. MATTERS ARISING

Energy and Solar Panels – whilst this is being considered by the committee other projects currently have a greater priority. The committee is still investigating the cost of the panels and the installation.

Radiant Heaters – the ongoing issue of heating the courts is concern for the club. After speaking with other clubs who have successfully installed radiant heater technology it was agreed that radiant heaters should be installed on Courts 2 and 4 in the first instance. The committee are in the process of looking at products and electrics.

Padel Tennis and Pickleball – the club has spoken to two other local clubs (Halton & Berkhamsted) and whilst the club would love to install a padel court in particular as it is a fast-growing sport, there is insufficient space within the current footprint of the club (Padel 21x11 metres, Pickleball 9.144 x 19.5 meters).

The club is exploring options for others to use the courts and the lounge area at quieter times. Tentative talks have been had with a yoga group but no firm bookings currently.

4. OFFICERS' REPORTS

4.1 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - Mark Bullard

MB thanked the committee for their help and support throughout the year. Thanks go to Keith Warman who has been the men's team captain for over 15 years and undertaken court maintenance and club development. MB also wished to thank Derek Beard and Benny Trueman for their continued work, and thanks to Matt Duncan for arranging the comedy night and Benny Trueman for the variety of social events that he continues to put on, the bar has been set very high and to Nigel Kerry as house manager who tries to meet the challenge of ever-changing regulations. Several members were standing down this year including Keith Warman, Matt Duncan, Charles Lefevre, Merrill Trueman and Kelly Gascoigne thanks go to all of them for their help and support over a number of years.

This year has been one of execution and the key achievements for the year were agreed by the committee and sign posted at last year's AGM. Positive feedback has been received but the most visible is the refurbishment of the lounge area, which has been well received by most of the members. The Ladies' changing room is also a great success.

The club has introduced a new electronic point of sale (EPOS) till payment system which is easy to use. Over 60 volunteer bar staff have had training, and thanks must go to Matt Duncan and Andy Booth for this. Bar key arrangements are now much simpler.

A new coffee facility is in place in the club's lounge and thanks for this must go to Anthony Palmer.

It's been a busy squash year with the Club Championships, handicap and racketball tournaments having been held and largely overseen by Charles LeFevre. A very successful Bronze event was held and second Bronze Master Event, is due to be held in November. It would be nice to see a few more club players participating in these events. Team squash has been very successful; team sponsorship is being repeated and the club are Champions and Herts Cup runners up.

Club Challenges for the coming year – to look at ways for the Lounge to be utilised as an all-day facility with coffee and Wi-Fi. This might enable the club to attract more members.

Court heating – with energy increases this is a concern for the club. The club has signed a new 3-year contract, but members must expect increased energy costs of up to 45%.

Active year for car park hires. Looking at investment in the car park to reduce the frequency of car park repairs.

President thanked all of the committee for their commitment to the squash club and wished to thank those members who were standing down for all their help and support.

4.2 SECRETARY'S REPORT – Jan Kerry.

The Committee met on 6 occasions during the year and all meetings were quorate. Minutes of the meetings are posted on the club's website.

<u>4.3 TREASURER'S REPORT AND CONSIDERATION OF THE ACCOUNTS – Peter</u> Barham ("PB")

PB noted his thanks to Mark for his significant contribution to the club over the last year and thanks to all of the volunteers and to Benny for some magnificent events that he has put on over the last year.

Peter Barham presented a summary of the accounts over the last financial year to the 30th June 2024. The accounts are unaudited, but they have been reviewed and approved by the external accountants.

Two major projects undertaken: Lounge costs were £45K plus £15K for furniture Ladies changing room £35k with a further £12K to go out in July.

However, the club still has cash in the bank at the end of June of £131K which is down on the previous year of £179K, but this can be used for future projects.

Grass Roots Squash Development reserve – relates to sponsorship money received and has been fully allocated against coaching costs.

Highlights noted by PB:

- Bar sales £63.6k vs £58.4k the prior year period.
- Subscription and entry fees Up to £36k from £30.7k.
- Coaching down from £8,7k to £6.9k
- Maintenance and repairs down from £18.8k to £13.5k

Healthy overall surplus of £17.5k

Any questions:

Geoff Bray - is there any correlation between bar refurbishment and the bar profits? A – we have no valid data

Paul Armstrong – is the roof reserve sufficient?

A – a roof survey was done by the supplier, and it was reported that there was no obvious deterioration. Other institutions have had similar roof for over 60 years. PB noted that prudently we should always have it, and perhaps we should increase it.

Simon Smith – Booking system costs are 2000 down on last year, why is this?

A – Sponsorship had been received for the first team, and the club were paying two better players.

Nigel Kerry noted that the card charges should come down with the new EPOS system in place.

The adoption of the accounts were approved unanimously by the meeting. Allan Whittow proposed, seconded by Anthony Palmer.

Ladies Captains Report 2024 Jo Preston

The ladies continued their good run with another great season. The ladies first team defended their Herts league title, winning for a second consecutive season - well done to everyone who played. We didn't have quite as strong a performance in the Bucks league, finishing last with some competition from other teams.

The 2nd team had a good season finishing a respectable 5 out of 8 teams in the Buck's second division.

Well done to both teams and thank you to Ruth Proudfoot and Maddy Hughes for taking over the running of the second team. Thank you also to all the players in both squads who have contributed. To any new players, please let me know if you are interested in team squash for the upcoming season.

There are no summer leagues for the ladies' divisions so we have been looking forward to the 2024/25 season which has recently kicked off. As we have done for a few years now, the Tring ladies 1st team is entered into the Herts 1st division and the Bucks 1st division. The Tring ladies 2nd team is entered into the Bucks 2nd division. team this season. Matches are played either on Monday or Wednesday nights.

Away from the team matches, we have a number of our Tring ladies playing at a county level During the last season the Herts Ladies O40s team successfully defended their national title, well done ladies!

Thanks again go to Katie Winterstein who continues to organise events to encourage ladies' squash at Tring. Thanks also to Rob Dunford for his coaching of the beginner ladies event earlier in the year and previous ladies team training sessions - we wish you well in your new job.

4.6 MEN'S CAPTAIN'S REPORT – by Keith Warman

This winter season we again split our three teams between Herts and Bucks. The Bucks team in division 1 was run by Alex Preston, they had a much better season than last, finishing a credible third.

We had two Herts teams, one in division 1 and one in division 2. Steve Malduca captained the 1st team and congratulations to them as they won the division, as we

recruited new talent to the club with the help of sponsorship from some of the clubs long standing members.

The 2nd team, run by lain Digby & James Taylor struggled, in my view down to prioritising players to play in our Bucks team over the Herts team, they finished just above the relegation zone.

This winter we expect to run in a very similar vein as last season.

Again, we did not enter a team into the Herts summer squash league. However, we did enter two teams in the Bucks racketball league. The 1st team in division 1 captained by Steve Malduca had a much stronger team than in previous seasons and managed to finish second. We also entered a 2nd team in division 1 too, captained by Paul Hobday. Despite a difficult start they did manage to win a few matches and ended up one off the foot of the table. Congratulations to both teams.

Even more players at the club have seen the benefits of playing racketball, where the number of players seems to grow year on year.

I'd like to thank the team captains again for their efforts this past year and I would also like to thank Charles Lefevre for running many of the tournaments, the squash and racketball internal leagues, as well as a Three Counties squash tournament, a great job.

The event will be run again in November by Chas, let's hope that many more Tring squash players enter than last year.

I am standing down this year after many years of service. I'm handing the reigns over to Steve Malduca, I just hope you all give him the same support that you gave me.

4.7 JUNIOR REPORT – presented by Katie Winterstein

KW reported another successful year for the juniors. 23/24 was the first year of the junior community voice for squash U.K. which is designed to involve and empower young players. Numbers continued to be good with Wednesday training well supported. KW wanted to thank Ethan Duncan, Sean Slade and Robert Dunford for all their hard work. KW noted that Robert Dunford was also available to coach. KW also wished to than Charles Lefevre for all of his hard work and support throughout the year.

5 OTHER REPORTS

5.1 House Management – by Nigel Kerry. Summary presented at the meeting.

Few leaks in the roof again. These appear to have been fixed but it will only be a short while before another large branch does more damage.

The guttering around the single storey is due to be cleared over the next few days but will need doing again once the leaves have all fallen.

The roof above the courts will need clearing of leaves in a few weeks' time. A couple of volunteers with a head for heights would be handy

A new security light has been fitted at top of the entrance corridor. Hopefully its been set so that it lights up before you get to the steps.

The extractor system in men's changing room has been repaired. A side effect of this was lots of debris being blown out onto the ceiling. To be cleaned.

Flooding of garden. During the summer a conversation was started with a local company who handle soak-aways. There was no conclusion as far as I'm aware so will have another go at this over the next few weeks. This is important to solve as the flooding is causing a problem of damp at the front of court 2

The lounge heating system seemed to work well during the winter. I'm keen to instal a remote system so that it easily turn it off, or on, for functions

There were the usual complaints about the court heating. Too hot or too cold usually applying to the same court. As heard a new system is being planned for courts 2 & 4.

Request that heating in men's changing room is not turned on without asking house manager first as the programmer needs to be updated so the heating comes on during the day rather than the middle of the night.

Waiting for decorator to give quote for painting the areas around court 3. Its 4 years since they were last done and as an area of high use. The carpet on court 3 seats was cleaned and looks much better.

The oven has just had its 6-month clean. If using the oven please clean it properly afterwards.

Finally, if you're approached by a member with a complaint, or a comment about the state of the Club, you refer them to me. It is important to me that I'm able to talk to the person with the complaint. This means I will get a better idea of what they actually want, rather than a third person's interpretation of the problem. I'm happy for my mobile number and the House Manager email address to be shown in a future information email if that helps.

5.2 Social – Mark Bullard

The club is very active with numerous members parties held over the last year or booked in. Thanks to Kelly Gascoine for managing bar staff for all the various events.

Thanks to Benny for organising a number of club events – Abba, Skarmungers and also Elvis at Christmas. All entertaining evenings. Thanks also to Matt Duncan who

ran a successful comedy evening. Chillfest was also a great success again this year.
