1. MATTERS ARISING

A - CHAIRMAN

D - SECRETARY

MB informed the committee that Pendley Sport Centre (PSC) is looking at car park management options to address the car parking issues. The shortage of car parking is the biggest issue facing PSC. PSC is looking to ensure that all available parking is utilised effectively, as well as making the local authorities and other sports bodies aware of the issues.

The feedback from the committee is for PSC: -

- 1. To clearly communicate to the council our concern that the current situation will lead to a tragic accident.
- 2. To continue to press the councils to help find a meaningful solution.
- 3. To ensure that PSC is doing everything it can to alleviate car parking problems, e.g. through maximising availability of all the car parks and stewarding.
- 4. To ensure any car parking management measures deployed address the real problems we face, and not be unnecessarily severe.

The committee recognised the need for meaningful action.

TEAM REPORTS:

E – MEN'S CAPTAIN

KW apologised to the committee about his behaviour during a recent club match and assured us that it won't happen again.
